Philadelphia, PA ... On **Saturday, January 31st at 4:00 PM**, student musicians in the three ensembles that make up the [Musicopia String Orchestras](#) (MSO) program will present their annual Winter Concert at the Church of the Holy Trinity (1904 Walnut St). MSO students from across the Philadelphia area have spent the fall semester preparing for this concert, which showcases their dedication and growth as musicians.

This free public concert features a diverse repertoire of composers and musical styles. The program includes **the premiere of a new work, “Hoist Your Sails,” by up-and-coming composer Nat Penn**, winner of the [Wildflower Composers’](#) Call for Scores, which drew a competitive pool of submissions from across the country.

The concert’s featured piece is George Gershwin’s “Oh, Lady Be Good!” a jazz standard that showcases several solos. As part of the MSO’s commitment to choosing repertoire that challenges students, Dr. Jessica Morel shared: “At first, the students were hesitant about playing jazz and swing rhythms. For most of them, it was their first time playing in this style, which can feel like learning a new language. But after the first few rehearsals, they began to get into the groove of it, and now they love playing the Gershwin! We’re very excited about that highlight of the program.”

Younger students will perform the festive piece “Snowflakes,” and Holst’s beloved “Jupiter” from *The Planets*. The concert will also feature additional pieces by classical masters Dvorák, Prokofiev, Mozart, and Vivaldi.
